What participants will learn in Policy Partners:

- How the legislative process works in New Hampshire, including the budget process, state elections, and how a bill becomes law.
- How to review and choose which bills to work on.
- How to conduct 1-to-1 interviews with legislators and candidates and how to build lasting relationships and alliances with them.
- How to be more persuasive and to frame issues you care about.
- How to provide public testimony (both written and oral).
- Where legislative hearings take place and how to participate in them.
- How to respond to Calls-to-Action.
- How to successfully advocate for the full and equal rights of citizens who have disabilities in New Hampshire.

What Policy Partners expects from you:

- Attend and be prepared for all scheduled training sessions and meetings.
- Initiate and maintain monthly contact/interaction with your Mentor.
- Follow the Guide Scope & Sequence and complete the guide section activities in the time allotted.
- Attend at least one legislative hearing during the session and provide written or oral testimony.



• Conduct at least two 1 to 1 interviews with your fellow mentees and at least 1 with your representative(s) or candidate(s) (after training).

Application Questions:

- 4. Have you ever done or participated in any of the following (please elaborate on each experience)?
 - a. Written a Letter to the Editor about an issue important to you?
 - b. Attended a legislative hearing; submitted testimony to a hearing?
 - c. Called, emailed, written or met with one of your representatives?
 - d. Attended a rally, protest or other type of action?
